RESPONSE TO THE EMERGENCY

The ADN Dignidad program provided access to basic needs to the most vulnerable population affected by COVID-19. The program scaled-up its coverage, accelerated its operations, and, in this way, improved efficiency of the humanitarian assistance provided. Between April and August 2020, 53,187 new participants were enrolled, an increase of 345% compared to the first 6 months of operations.


