


ABOUT ADN DIGNIDAD

ADN Dignidad (DNA Dignity in english) provides humanitarian assistance to the vulnerable migrant population coming from Venezuela, Colombian returnees and host communities, aiming at providing access to basic goods and services, contributing to alleviate their needs, and promoting their integration into the Colombian society.

Our consortium is integrated by three international humanitarian organizations:

- Action Against Hunger
- Danish Refugee Council
- Norwegian Refugee Council



NOVEMBER 2019 - APRIL 2020



During the first 6 months of operation, we have delivered, in Colombian pesos (COP), the equivalent to 1.3 million United States Dollars (USD) to highly vulnerable individuals.


According to the household composition and after a detailed selection process based on clearly defined vulnerability criteria, the beneficiaries received monthly between 126.250 and 252.500 COP (between 35 and 70 USD) during 6 months, giving priority to women, children, elderly persons and persons with disabilities. The amounts follow the National Government guidelines for the distribution of MPCA in the country.




