#### **PROGRES V4 SYSTEM**


UNHCR uses two types of registration in Brazil:

- Individual: Biometric data collection, protecting needs and individualized details for each family member for UNHCR actions.
- Family Entity: Collected for all individuals in a family group, but with household data as a whole. Used for population monitoring purposes.





## Sheltering

#### **COOPERATION**

Sheltering is one of the pillars of the Federal Government's Operação Acolhida. UNHCR provides support to the Ministry of Citizenship (MdC) in managing 13 temporary shelters and an emergency space, through the Volunteer Association for International Service (AVSI), Fraternity - International Humanitarian Federation (FFHI) and the Fraternity Without Borders (FSF) in coordination with the Ministry of Defense and under the coordination of the Federal Sheltering Subcommittee.

- FT provides services in infrastructure, safety, health and dental and food support.
- The Humanitarian Agency of the Seventh-day Adventist Church (ADRA) and Pirilampos Institute develop WASH (water, sanitation and hygiene) and child protection activities in several shelters.


Because more than 1500 people were relocated in the last month, the border and some shelters in Boa Vista were closed, their occupation is currently below the average of 5,000 people. However, communication efforts with communities led by UNHCR are contributing to increase the number of refugees and migrants living in spontaneous occupations to move into shelters.

In addition, during the month of August, actions to relocate people from the Embratel spontaneous occupation to the 13 de Setembro Emergency Space continue, which is already working with half the population. 13 de Setembro Space will be included in sheltering numbers, although it is not categorized as such, as it is a temporary and emergency area, which is part of the Emergency Plan for Spontaneous Occupations of *Operação Acolhida*.






## GOVERNANCE STRUCTURE IN THE SHELTERS

For shelter maintenance work efficiently and continuously, specific functions such as cleaning, food distribution, health case monitoring, among others are carried out by the **Committees** (members of the refugee community and sheltered migrants) andsupervised by the shelter management team.

Members have several responsibilities, which favors empowerment and community participation.

#### AVERAGE STAY IN THE SHELTERS (DAYS)



Shelters in Roraima have the temporarily duty of hosting refugees and migrants arriving in Brazil from Venezuela. The average stay in shelters is **201 DAYS**. UNHCR is currently working to reduce average stay in an effort to promote the integration of refugees and migrants.

However, indigenous shelters have an average of **331 DAYS**. These groups face specific challenges in finding lasting solutions, thus impacting their length of stay.




UN Refugee Agency (UNHCR) donated 180 beds to the Boa Vista field hospital, built by Operação Acolhida Logistics Humanitarian Task Force to assist refugees and migrants from Venezuela and Brazilian victims of COVID-19 in the border state from Roraima. UNHCR has been collaborating systematically with APC since the development of the architectural plan for this field hospital. Besides this technical assistance, UN Refugee Agency donated 250 modular houses (or RHUs/ Refugee Housing Units) used in Operação Acolhida temporary shelters, allowing 1,000 people assisted in the wing to isolate suspected and confirmed APC cases. It also donated two thousand regular beds and mattresses to the hospital, allowing a wide service to the population of Boa Vista. **READ MORE** 

## **JARDIM FLORESTA**

#### **GENERAL INFORMATION**

Opened in the first quarter of 2018, the shelter has a family profile and is supported by many actors. ADRA and Pirilampos organizations, UNICEF partners, carry out activities in the WASH (Water, Sanitation and Hygiene) and child protection areas, respectively, on an ongoing basis.


## LATIFE SALOMÃO

#### **GENERAL INFORMATION**

Opened in April 2018, initially intended for couples, men and women alone. In the first half of 2019, after heavy rain in the capital of Roraima, UNHCR, together with FT, opted to change the profile to receive families with children, especially those living at the bus station. Currently, the profile is families with children and women living alone, as well as people with disabilities and the LGBTI community.

## **NOVA CANAÃ**

#### **GENERAL INFORMATION**

It was the sixth shelter built by Operation Welcome. Inaugurated in April 2018, it is intended for the allocation of families. It has a child and adolescent friendly space that hosts children and adolescents from 2 to 17 with the support from World Vision and UNICEF.

## **PINTOLÂNDIA**

#### **GENERAL INFORMATION**

One of the oldest shelters of Operação Acolhida, opened in December 2016. The space initially worked to serve the indigenous population of Venezuelan refugees and migrants, who were on the street and came as part of the first flow that arrived in Roraima in 2014. The shelter is divided almost entirely between ethnic groups Warao e E'ñepá. The shelter's profile is mixed between men and women, with indigenous families divided into eight aidamos (leader Warao) and an ijan (leader E'ñepa) who are responsible for each group.






In this shelter, instead of common UNHCR Housing Units (RHU), there are hammocks where different groups organize themselves with their communities.


Flow 1: destined for UNHCR persons of interest that are considered a priority in the shelter-to-shelter modality.




## **RONDON 3**

#### **GENERAL INFORMATION**


Inaugurated in October 2018, it is the 13th shelter built in Roraima, the largest shelter not only for Operação Acolhida, but also in Latin America. It has a varied profile and the ability to accommodate almost 1,400 people with its expansion in early 2020. The shelter is also known for the structure of committees engaged with community and cultural issues, such as the cinema committee or that of *voceros* (community promoters).



#### INFORMAÇÃO GERAL



## **13 DE SETEMBRO**

#### **GENERAL INFORMATION**

On May 11, 2020, UNHCR, in partnership with NGO Fraternity Without Borders (Fraternidade Sem Fronteiras) and in coordination with the Humanitarian Logistics Task Force, opened the new Emergency Space, with to provide minimum humanitarian standards for people of interest to UNHCR who lived in the Embratel Spontaneous Occupation. In the first and second phases of the project, UNHCR supplied 30 Refugee Housing Units (RHUs) with solar lamps and mattresses. The transformation project has a five-stage plan that involves improving infrastructure and promoting community participation.





#### **GENERAL INFORMATION**


Opened in October 2017, the shelter was initially managed only by the State of Roraima Civil Defense. In March 2018, it is a shelter for unmarried men, and is now coordinated by International Humanitarian Fraternity, in partnership with UNHCR.




## JANOKOIDA

#### **GENERAL INFORMATION**

POPULATION PROFILE (AUGUST 2020)

Janokoida means, in native Warao language, "Big House". In this shelter, instead of regular Housing Units (RHU) UNHCR has networks where different groups organize with their communities. The indigenous Warao families are divided into leaders responsible for their groups called '*aidamos*'.





- Meeting between UNICEF agents, Aidamos group and World Vision agent on new ways to assist and reshape educational activities established at the shelter (UNICEF, World Vision, Fraternity-FFHI, Aidamo).
- Activity carried out with young children and adolescents. Topic: prevention of sexual abuse and violence against children and adolescents. (Mosaico Project/UNICEF and Mobilizers of the Mosaico Project in AJK).
- Mosaico project presentation "Generación en Movimiento" (Generation in Moviment). Topics for preventing and fighting Covid-19. (Mosaico Projecto/UNICEF and Mobilizers of the Mosaico project in AJK).

- Audio record of Warao tales with Professor Alejandrina, one of those housed in Janokoida, for Radio
   "Dibunoko Yakera" myth and legend session. Carried out by Consejo de comunicación (Communication Board).
- Construction of Vertical Gardens with pet bottles collected by the shelter community, preparing the land with fertilizer and EPOCAN donated by UNHCR and EB; organizing several plant seedlings donated by UNHCR for a landscaping project during the Janokoida environmental week.
   (organized by FFHI and Environmental Council formed by beneficiaries).



## **Shelter profiles: Pacaraima**

### **BV-8**

#### **GENERAL INFORMATION**

This shelter is a transit accommodation that considers the following flows:

Flow 1: intended for people who have not completed the process of obtaining documentation or who are waiting for another service available at the Relocation, Documentation and Screening Centers (PITRIG), as well as people who have completed these processes and are allowed to spend the night there and move on to their destination the next day. Recommended capacity: up to 500 people.

Flow 2 e 3: intended for vulnerable people who should be transferred to shelters in Boa Vista (flow 2) and people approved to participate in the interiorization process (flow 3). Recommended capacity: 500 people

Flow 4: intended for vulnerable homeless people who are not part of any of the previous flows (arrived after the Relocation, Documentation and Screening Centers (PITRIG) are closed; missed the bus, etc.), provided that they intend to apply for temporary residence or refuge. There is no recommended capacity, the vacancies are overnight and are allocated as available, considering the total capacity of the shelter.
