

### 'Your Life Changes' (Tu Vida Cambia in Spanish) the human trafficking prevention campaign developed by the IOM's Migration Governance Strengthening Program, broadcasted a series of virtual concerts through social media. The activity reached 57,000 views, a far bigger audience than previous in-presence concerts within the campaign. This initiative was conceived as a journey of musical performances on Colombian roads in which Venezuelan 'walkers' could receive messages of prevention and protection against human trafficking, and currently is on its third phase of implementation. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the strategy shifted to virtual

concerts and prevention messages broadcasted online and on national radio stations. The campaign has reached


