VENEZUELAN REFUGEES AND MIGRANTS

November 2020



By the end of February 2020, more than **1.8 million** Venezuelans were living in Colombia. Since the end of March, around **6%** of the population has returned to Venezuela, mostly due to the impact of the mandatory isolation measures introduced by the National Government, as part of the response to the **COVID-19** pandemic.

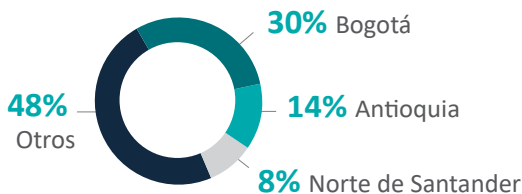
711,891 Venezuelans with Special Stay Permits (PEP, by its acronym in Spanish).

129,269 renewed phase III (PEP-RAM) permits from 4 July 2020.

7,889 PEPFF permits (to promote the formalization of labor) since February 2020.

15,479 PEP VI permits (new phase from October 15, 2020 until February 15, 2021.)*

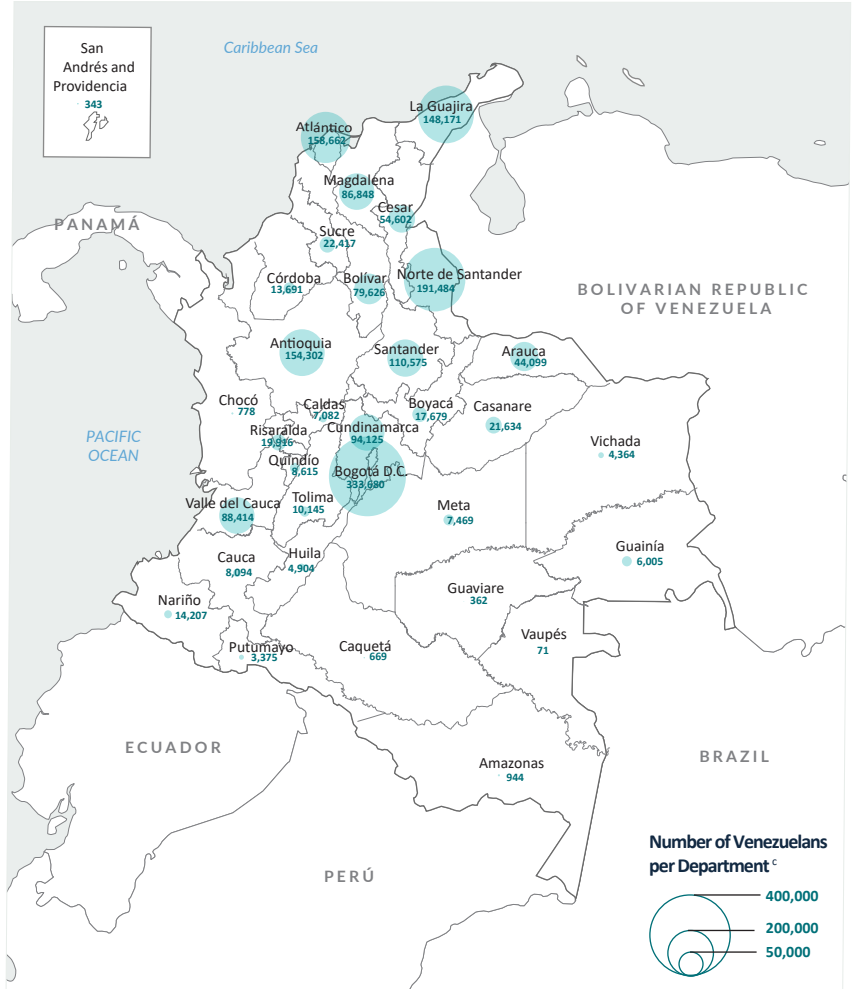
Departments with the largest concentration of Venezuelans with Special Stay Permits:

52,797 temporary transit permits issued (PIP-PTT, by its acronym in Spanish) from 1 January to 5 April 2020.

91,181 exits from Colombia to third countries since January 2020.

122,397 exits into Venezuela through official crossing points since 14 March 2020.
