## COLOMBIA VENEZUELAN REFUGEES AND MIGRANTS September 2020



By the end of February 2020, more than 1.8 million Venezuelans were living in Colombia. Since the end of March, about 6% of the population has returned to their homes in Venezuela, mostly due to the measures of Mandatory Preventive Isolation decreed by the National Government to deal with the COVID-19 pandemic.


## With the intention to stay<sup>b</sup>




### In circular movement<sup>b</sup>

- Areas where the use of TMF is valid






### In transit<sup>b</sup>
