By the end of February 2020, more than 1.8 million Venezuelans were living in Colombia. Since the end of March, about 3% of the population has returned to their homes in Venezuela, mostly due to the measures of Mandatory Preventive Isolation decreed by the National Government to deal with the COVID-19 pandemic.


