One out of three Venezuelan refugee and migrant children **went to bed hungry.**



Six out of ten Venezuelan refugee and migrant children **were out of school.**



One out of four Venezuelan refugee and migrant children **were separated from both parents.**

Separated and unaccompanied children will continue to be a priority in 2021, as they face greater risks of exposure to different forms of violence, child labor, forced recruitment, and exploitation.
