WE LEARNED

We must increase visibility of the situation faced by Venezuelan refugee and migrant children and take into account their specific needs in relevant planning processes.

Separated and unaccompanied children will continue to be a priority in 2021, as they face greater risks of exposure to different forms of violence, child labor, forced recruitment, and exploitation.

WE SAW

One out of three Venezuelan refugee and migrant children went to bed hungry.



Six out of ten Venezuelan refugee and migrant children were out of school.



One out of four Venezuelan refugee and migrant children

were separated from both parents.
