







10-14% of the population in R4V Caribbean countries are refugees & migrants from

Venezuelans are exposed to numerous protection risks.

Lack of documentation and pathways to regularization remain critical challenges affecting Venezuelans' rights and access to services across all sectors, and protection risks related to GBV, detention and deportation are particularly severe.

Beyond legal and general protection issues, food insecurity and inadequate shelter were the main needs expressed by Venezuelans in the Caribbean.

Integration challenges
persist, as most Caribbean
countries are small island
nations where refugees &
migrants are confronted with
limited absorption capacities,
cultural-linguistic barriers, and
xenophobia.

These factors are compounded in as concerns access to education, with only a small proportion of Venezuelan children and youth attending formal education programs.
