### HIGHLIGHTS

- **The launch of the RMRP update 2024** took place in Panama. In its fifth year since the launch of the first RMRP in 2019, the greatest target populations include protection, health, and food security. The need to continue advocating for the Venezuelan refugee and migrant population and their host communities was reiterated. At the same time, particular emphasis was placed on advancing towards **assistance to other populations in transit** that also require international support and protection.

## SITUATION

- **The new National Migratory Policy took effect on 27 December and represents a significant development for a safe, orderly and regular migration.** The policy establishes a mandate for various institutions in the country, **with 27 measures to be implemented immediately focus on the security of the territory.** By the reporting period, biometric registration close with **182,117 people registered**, 90.8% of whom are Venezuelans, with an equal gender distribution (50.2% are women and 49.8% are men). The majority are concentrated in the central regions of Chile, with 56.9% residing in the Metropolitan Region (RM), 8.5% in Valparaíso, and 5.6% in Biobío. And **946 deportations** occurred.
- The Government of Chile reported the departure of the first charter flight with **16 deported migrants to Venezuela** (10 administrative and 6 judicial). The National Migration Service stated that, thanks to cooperation with the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and diplomatic efforts with Venezuela, authorization for this flight was obtained following a previous refusal. By the end of 2023, **1,189 administrative deportation orders had been issued.**

## RESPONSE

- **SHELTER:** Throughout December, 971 refugees and migrants from Venezuela benefited from shelter solutions such as rental subsidies and temporary individual and family accommodation in different regions of the country. Alongside, a local NGO was supported through the provision of technological and furniture equipment intended for services and programs aimed at the integration and reception of refugees and migrants.
- **INTEGRATION:** Regarding economic and socio-cultural integration, various activities and initiatives were carried out with 1,630 refugees and migrants from Venezuela participating together with 47 people from host communities. These activities encompass a wide range of initiatives, such as robust support for enhancing gastronomic enterprises, courses in entrepreneurship, workshops focusing on digital literacy for entrepreneurs, and career guidance sessions. Additionally, looking for more welcoming communities, platform partners conducted workshops for local leaders, government officials, and youth to promote and strengthen actions with local networks on inclusion, collaboration, and the fulfillment of the rights and obligations of refugees and migrants. Spaces with young people in sports settings have been promoted as a place for multicultural gatherings.
- **PROTECTION:** Throughout the reporting period, 4,580 Venezuelans benefited from protection services, encompassing legal attention and case follow-up regarding migratory regularization, representation in administrative and/or judicial proceedings of the Legal Area, and workshops and initiatives such as the Migrant Services Fair. Also, 396 girls and women participated in a series of workshops aimed at identifying, preventing, and responding to gender-based violence. Additionally, 3,331 children received socio-emotional support, mainly in the northern regions, to help them process their migration-related grief and continue their educational journey in their host country. A total of 159 public servants participated in workshops related to the prevention and protection against human trafficking.



- HEALTH:** During this period, 96 refugees and migrants received mental health care in Santiago and 146 children in Tarapacá access first health services and care.
- FOOD SECURITY:** 981 refugees and migrants from Venezuela received food security assistance this month, with activities including delivering individual food kits, feeding in shelters, and providing food services to people living in the streets. The interventions mainly focus on providing a space for sharing with others during the Christmas festivities, as part of a human-centered approach. While 139 care takers receive tools on nutrition para la primera infancia y 131 niñas accedieron a una evaluación nutricional.
- WASH:** On December, 3,021 refugees and migrants received humanitarian assistance through hygiene services in learning facilities and safe spaces, the distribution of group hygiene kits, as well as safe and appropriate facilities for children, in addition to the provision of jerry cans of water and diapers.
