CONTEXT: The statistics displayed above on Venezuelan migrants and refugees in the 17 countries of the R4V Response reflect official figures issued by the respective host governments. Their use and publishing for R4V products is closely coordinated with relevant government statistical offices and/or other national government departments responsible for management of refugee and migrant statistics. These statistics are periodically updated, with some governments updating them monthly, while others update them in other undefined intervals. As a result, an increase in reported figures from one month's R4V publication to the next in any country could appear as a significant increase in arrivals of Venezuelan refugees and migrants, while, in fact, it is mostly related to individual host country reporting and publishing procedures.

What is the reason for the recent increase in number of migrants and refugees from Venezuela?

BRAZIL: By September 2024, the population of Venezuelan refugees and migrants in Brazil stands at 626,885. This figure reflects a 7.1% increase compared to the previously reported total of 585,361 (May 2024). As reflected in the corresponding [R4V Movements Report](#) during the third quarter of 2024, a steady rate of Venezuelan arrivals was recorded by the International Traffic System (STI) of the Federal Police Department of the Ministry of Justice and Public Security.

From January 2017 to September 2024, the National Migration Registry System (SISMIGRA) of the Federal Police documented the presence of 527,648 Venezuelan refugees and migrants with active residence authorizations in Brazil. This represents a 4.9% increase compared to the previous figure of 503,126 (May 2024) individuals. Additionally, as of September

2024, the National Committee for Refugees (CONARE), the government body responsible for recognizing refugee status, had granted refugee status to 134,070 Venezuelans, representing a 0.9% increase compared to the previous figure of 132,812 (May 2024).

ARGENTINA: The population of Venezuelan refugees and migrants in Argentina is estimated using data from the 2022 census published by INDEC, updated with the sum of the monthly balance of entries and exits, provided by the National Directorate of Migration, which monitors regular entries and exits from the country.

By 30 September 2024, the Venezuelan refugee and migrant population in Argentina was estimated at 165,616 people, reflecting recent regular movements and adjusting the total population in Argentina by 8%.

URUGUAY: The estimation of the Venezuelan refugee and migrant population in Uruguay is based on data provided by the National Directorate of Migration (DNM), using the accumulated regular balance of entries and exits since 2015. As of September 2024, it is estimated that 41,166 Venezuelan individuals reside in Uruguay, representing a population increase of 2.7% compared to June 2024 and a 6.7% increase, when compared to 2023.
