1	Feedback on Donor's Conference	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Conference raised over 1.5 billion USD for the response.</li> <li>- Of that, +-900 M was in grants (not loans) which amounts to a 40% increase from last year.</li> <li>- There were 6 new donor countries.</li> <li>-Over 7,000 participants watched the conference on 17 June.</li> <li>- Events in the lead-up to the conference helped increase awareness, information, and pledges ultimately were up over 50%.</li> <li>- Civil society event had ~480 registered participants.</li> </ul>	Continue reporting to FTS all funds received for RMRP 2021.	As soon as funds are received.
2	RMRP 2022: Planning Process (incl. general vision, key changes and next steps)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Timeline: similar to last year (see PPT slides).</li> <li>• Also tied to other external timelines we don't control (for ex., Global Humanitarian Overview will be launched in December and RMRP inputs for the same need to be submitted some time in (early) November.</li> <li>• By end August, we will require results of all JNAs</li> <li>• By 15 August, definition of sector objectives / outcomes &amp; regional core indicators &gt; this is a key action point for all regional sectors</li> <li>• On 8 July, the Platform team will share additional information at the regional platform meeting, including survey results.</li> <li>• On 19 July, the Platform will share full regional planning instructions.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• R4V Regional Platform will follow-up to share who in each org received the survey.</li> <li>• R4V Regional Platform will follow-up on draft results framework per sector.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• By 25 June, it is envisaged that sector will receive an Excel document with a draft results framework from the R4V Regional Platform (with suggested outcome indicators, etc).</li> </ul>

		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Survey currently sent out, to agencies that are part of the RMRP and R4V.</li> <li>• Important dates for regional sectors identified with “RS” in the “Key Dates Calendar.” Those include:             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- 15 August: Define Sector objectives, outcomes, RCIs</li> <li>- 17-30 September: Activity Consolidation &amp; Validation</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Regional sectors will be responsible to validate activities proposed in a given sector. This is the “Activity Validation.”</li> <li>• Introduction of “outcome indicators” in the RMRP 2022 (see PPT).             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- This will help move beyond counting people reached by activities to measuring the impact of the intervention.</li> <li>- Explanation of difference between monitoring output (report of activities in 5W) versus monitoring outcome (measuring a change in peoples’ situation over time).</li> <li>- Aligned with Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) outcome indicators.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Main steps for each sector: 1) Review sector objectives (outcome); 2) Review &amp; suggest new outcome indicators; 3) Review output results statements; 4) Improve RCIs (Regional Core Indicators).</li> <li>• RCIs are defined as “the primary responsibility of regional sectors.”</li> <li>• Proposed best practice for regional sectors is to hold sector workshops with regional, sub-regional and</li> </ul>

		<p>national sector leads to discuss the 2022 results framework.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• By 25 June, R4V regional platform will share an Excel document with every sector with a draft result framework.</li> <li>• In July/August, convene sector workshops with national sectors and R4V coordinators/IM/reporting teams.</li> <li>• By 15 August, deadline to submit final results framework for each sector to the regional platform.</li> <li>• A number of participants remarked that the link with SDGs was positive and alluded to existing frameworks to refer to in this respect</li> <li>• Regarding transversal issues and indicators, focal points were encouraged to actively reach out to sectors during the process of development of the sector objectives and indicators; it was highlighted that the Environment Focal Point was particularly effective in mainstreaming several environment considerations into sector discussion and thus in the RMRP 2021</li> </ul>
