Situation

On 30 October, the Ministry of Health (MoH) reported that 52 per cent of the population in Peru is fully vaccinated. As to Venezuelan population in the country, the coverage with two doses went from 12.6 to 27.1 per cent in one month, even though it is still lower than the national coverage.

As vaccination progresses in the country, regional authorities seek to reopen the land borders. President Pedro Castillo met with the governor in charge of Tumbes and promised to set up a technical table with, inter alia, the ministries of Health and Foreign Affairs, in order to reopen the northern border.

Regarding the advance on regularization mechanisms and access to documentation, on 27 October, the Superintendence of Migration (SNM) reported that around 37,000 Temporary Permanence Permit Card-CPP had been delivered, as well as 12,000 humanitarian residences.

Response

GTRM partners assisted some **18,200** refugees and migrants with general protection orientations (14,400) and with legal counselling (3,800), as well as 5,000 through case management. They have been advised and informed mainly about the regularization process of the CPP, through face-to-face and virtual activities. Given the continuous flow of refugees and migrants in transit despite land borders remaining closed, GTRM partners provided information and essential services to this vulnerable population through support spaces located along the northern coast (in Tumbes, Lambayeque, and Piura).

Some 2,500 persons received psychosocial assistance to address socioemotional needs and to promote well-being.

Almost 600 persons, including refugee and migrant community leaders, and civil servants, benefited from 34 workshops on GBV prevention, sexual and reproductive rights, complaint mechanisms to address human trafficking and smuggling, and prevention of sexual exploitation of children. Some trainings with refugees and migrants used audio-visual tools and theatrical games to raise awareness.

Some **210 survivors of GBV** received specialized assistance. Furthermore, partners assisted over 80 survivors of GBV and their families with Cash Based Interventions (CBI) in Callao, La Libertad, and Lima.

Some 170 highly vulnerable refugees and migrants benefited from alternative accommodations in hotels in Arequipa, Lima, Tacna and Trujillo, and almost 140 in shelters in Puno. As part of the shelter sectoral response partners supported access to housing for very vulnerable families, through CBI for 170 persons, and distributing some 40 kits with essential kitchen utensils.

GTRM partners distributed over **69,500 hot and cold meals** to support highly vulnerable refugees and migrants (both residing and in transit), as well as host community members. Partners focused on increasing the nutritional values for 3,200 persons in transit and host community members through supporting over 20 communal kitchens and community soup-kitchens with food. Some **2,400 family food kits** were distributed in Lima, Tacna and Tumbes. Nearly 41,000 persons at risk of food insecurity received CBI for a total of USD 1.57M to support access to food, including pre-paid food vouchers. This activity took place mainly in Lima and Callao and in seven other regions.

Partners also assisted over 200 vulnerable persons with humanitarian transport in Cusco, Lima, Piura, Puno, and Tumbes, including CBI for local transportation.

As part of WASH efforts, over **7,000 persons received some 4,700 hygiene kits** (including family and individual kits, and baby kits) in Arequipa, Lima, Puno, Tacna and Tumbes, in addition to some 650 kits for women and adolescents' sexual and reproductive health.

As part of the Education sectoral response, GTRM partners continued promoting school enrolment and preventing dropouts mainly related to the COVID-19 pandemic context. Almost **3,600 vulnerable refugee and migrant students enrolled with the support of partners** following the Ministry of Education's strategy for extraordinary school matriculation. Over 30 Venezuelan children received sectoral CBI to access basic education.

To support the permanence in the education system, partners distributed 470 school kits and 140 tablets in Arequipa, Lima, Piura, and Tumbes. GTRM partners facilitated the validation of 25 professional degrees.

As to Integration efforts, some 200 persons participated in capacity-development trainings on how to access decent work, employability, as well as the labour rights protection of foreign workers. **960** participated in entrepreneurship and self-employment programmes, including developing business plan, digital marketing, and ecommerce.

Nearly 200 functioning entrepreneurships received equipment and supplies, in addition 230 persons accessed the financial system and received financial education. With the support from GTRM partners, some 1,100 persons received CBI for livelihoods, including seed capital and the design of sustainable business plans, mainly in Lima and Callao.

Also, partners implemented socio-sports activities aimed at Venezuelan and Peruvian children between 6 and 16 years old to promote social inclusion and integration in two districts of Lima.

GTRM partners provided primary health assistance to over 2,400 refugees and migrants and host community members, basically in Lima and Callao, including some 80 persons living with HIV.

Some 400 persons received mental healthcare in Lima, and some 250 persons were supported to access treatment and pay for medical expenses through sectoral CBI.


Considering that the sanitary emergency continues, GTRM partners distributed PPE material and oriented on hygiene habits to refugees and migrants in transit, in addition to rehabilitating 4 health facilities in Lima.

Some 2,300 vulnerable persons received support to access the Comprehensive Health Insurance (SIS). GTRM partners also distributed over 250 kits for sexual and reproductive health, including

contraceptives for refugees and migrants, and host community members in Lima and Tumbes.

Coordination

GTRM's preparedness efforts have enabled its 87 partners to coordinate a sectorial approach to the R4V emergency response. Five partners joined the GTRM: Si, da Vida, Acción y Desarrollo, Médicos sin Fronteras, as well as Unión Venezolana and Veneactiva Peru, the last two in order to more actively involve the networks of Venezuelan organizations in the national platform's response. The GTRM continued supporting the dissemination of information both on and access to the COVID-19 vaccination, and on the regularization process to obtain the Temporary Residence Permit (CPP) card, and to access to the humanitarian residency.
