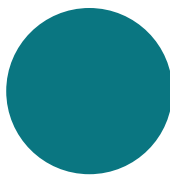
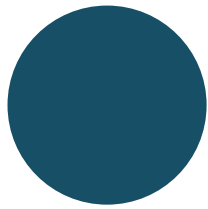
50% entered the host country irregularly:

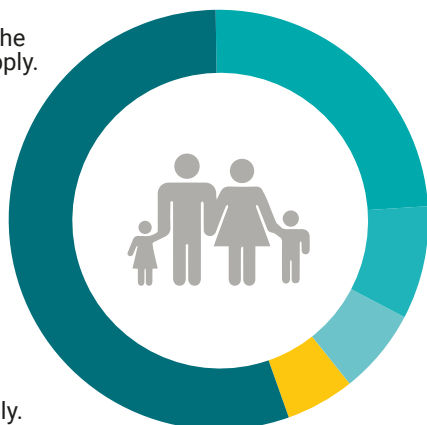

52% Doesn't have the intention to apply.



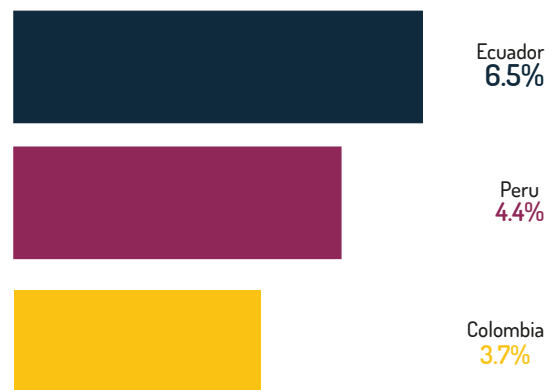
22.8% Intends to apply.
