## Situation

Regarding the deportation of Venezuelans occurred at the end of April in Piura (Northern coast), the Ombudspersons' Office [concluded](#) in June that the operation violated the fundamental rights of deportees, including partial reports and without guaranteeing due process of Law.

As a response, the mayor of Piura asked for the process to be faster and mentioned that he would meet with President Castillo to talk about civil security. In June, the Superintendence of Migration (SNM) reported that around 142,600 Temporary Permanence Permit Card-CPP had been delivered, as well as 25,000 humanitarian residences.

## Response

GTRM partners provided some 16,800 protection orientations to refugees and migrants, including legal counselling (6,300). In line with these efforts, over 140 persons received CVA to pay fines related to regularization and documentation procedures and to access these services. Over 1,400 refugees and migrants from Venezuela (including 160 children) received psychosocial assistance to address socioemotional needs and to promote well-being. Partners assisted some 200 persons through case management to access protection and services assistance. In addition, some 70 survivors of gender-based violence (GBV) as well as nine victims of trafficking received specialized assistance in person, including referrals to specialized entities.

As part of Child Protection efforts, over 200 parents and caregivers received support with workshops on child rearing. Furthermore, over 230 persons benefited from some 20 trainings and workshops in protection sectors.

Partners assisted some 30 highly vulnerable refugees and migrants with alternative accommodations in hotels in Arequipa and 200 in shelters in Lima and Tacna. Some 30 persons received kitchen sets to improve their shelter arrangements. Furthermore, the Shelter Sector response also included the distribution of thermal blankets to nearly 6,400 highly vulnerable persons to cope with the increasingly cold temperatures in Arequipa, Puno and Tacna. GTRM Partners distributed over **22,500 hot and cold meals** and 5,000 snacks to support **almost 9,000** highly vulnerable Venezuelan refugees, migrants, and host community members. Some **2,300 family food kits** were distributed. In addition, over **2,200 persons received Cash and Voucher Assistance (CVA) to support food security** due to the prevalence of food insecurity. As part of WASH efforts, almost 11,700 hygiene kits (including over 800 kits for women and adolescents' sexual and reproductive health) were distributed to Venezuelan refugees and migrants.

Partners supported over 360 refugee and migrant children to access education, as well as academic levelling and reinforcement activities. In addition, over 140 Venezuelan families received sectoral Cash-Based Interventions (CBI) to access basic education. To support the permanence in the public education system, partners **distributed school kits to 800 students** in Arequipa, Cusco, Moquegua, Tacna and

Tumbes, as well as provided tablets to almost 600 students in Arequipa, Lima and Tacna to help close the digital gap that increases desertion rates. Moreover, GTRM partners facilitated the **validation of some 200 professional degrees** to enable professionals from refugee and migrant communities to attain higher levels of income and decent job opportunities according to their educational level.












As to integration efforts, around 900 refugees and migrants participated in entrepreneurship and self-employment programmes. Likewise, over 4,100 persons accessed the financial system with the support from GTRM partners, including trainings on financial education. Nearly 30 functioning entrepreneurs continued to receive support, and 220 persons received sectoral CVA for livelihoods. In addition, 850 persons benefited from orientations on labour rights, including training on how to access decent work.

GTRM partners supported some 6,900 persons to access primary health care. Furthermore, some 1,000 persons received CVA support to access health services and treatment, while over 2,000 benefited from mental healthcare consultations. To promote the access of refugees and migrants to health insurance, over 2,000 refugees and migrants were assisted to access the Comprehensive Health Insurance (SIS). In addition, some 800 persons accessed HIV screening tests. Regarding Nutrition efforts, some 35 pregnant and lactating women received support on nutritional guidance.

Around USD 1.2 million were distributed to assist highly vulnerable refugees and migrants through multisectoral CBI.

## Coordination

GTRM's knowledge-sharing and planning efforts have enabled its 96 partners to coordinate a sectoral and cross-sectoral approach to respond to the needs of refugees and migrants. Socios en Salud, a social justice organization that provides health care to people living in extreme poverty, joined the GTRM.
