



UNHCR uses cash assistance to provide protection support and access to services to refugees and other forcibly displaced people.

Cash-based interventions, where feasible, are often a more dignified way of assisting affected populations, as they empower people to determine their own needs and the best way of meeting them.

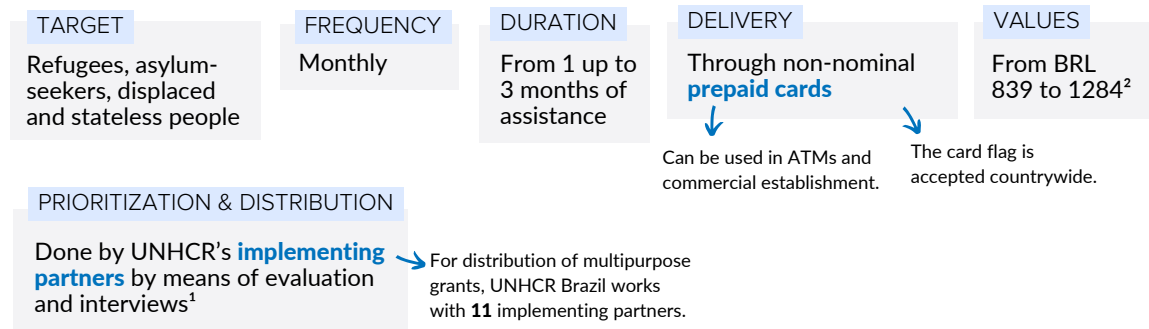
Well-designed and operationalized cash-based interventions also have a multiplier effect as they can directly benefit the local economy.

BRAZIL CONTEXT

The Brazilian Government, through social programs, provides families in situation of vulnerability and extreme poverty - including asylum-seekers, refugees, and migrants - with access to social assistance, health, education, employment and income.

The Multi-Purpose cash Grant (MPG) implemented by UNHCR ensures greater flexibility and power of choice for refugees and other forcibly displaced families: in Brazil, cash assistance is provided both for those in vulnerable situations and those participating in the voluntary relocation strategy (known as *interiorização*) led by the Federal Government.

UNHCR's cash assistance interventions in Brazil act as a bridge until refugee families find a way to support themselves or until they receive the government assistance. They are also a tool that promotes social and financial inclusion of forcibly displaced people.

2022 POST DISTRIBUTION MONITORING (PDM)

The **PDM report** provides an analysis of the impact of cash assistance for the families who have received such support during the year.

In cooperation with the Federal University of Uberlandia (UFU), UNHCR interviewed **181 people** through online survey and telephone.

The report shows that cash assistance has a **positive impact** in the lives of the benefitted families:



90%

reported that cash assistance improved their living conditions



84%

acknowledged that it reduced the feelings of stress

Top two expenditures made with cash assistance

72% rent
